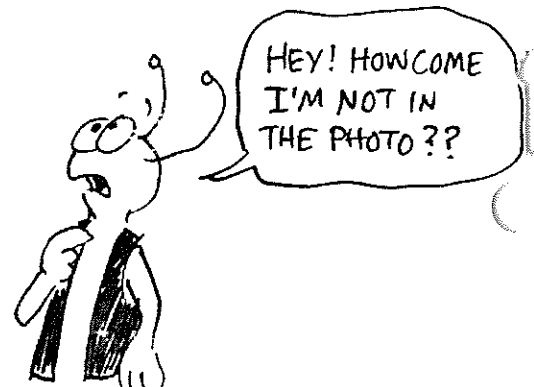

GU UPDATE

- GU has established a direct satellite link to Channel 1 in Moscow by which Soviet shows, including the news program Vremya, are broadcast live to the Intercultural Center on campus. During the recent coup, the program drew national attention and attracted crowds interested in reports via satellite.
- Members of the class of 1995 (ew!) will be required to live on campus for their first two years (no more lotteries for these guys). The policy was set in place last fall when the Board of Zoning Adjustment asked the University to house more students on campus (I guess they're not as mature as we were).
- The GU 4x1500m relay team won the Championship of America at the Penn Relay Carnival last April. The team took second in the Eastern Championships in the spring.
- The men's crew team won its first Intercollegiate Rowing Association Championship with a victory in the varsity fours with coxswain. The team also took home the Jack Bratten Team Point Trophy for overall excellence at that Dad Vails. This is the fourth consecutive year for this award.

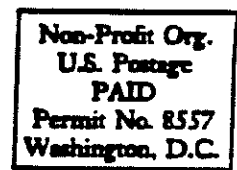
