Georgetown's founder John Carroll, namesake of our annual event, held Irish ancestry, and we've maintained a deep connection with Ireland throughout our history. In April 2024, when the Irish countryside is at its most beautiful, join alumni and friends to delve into Ireland's profound heritage on an exclusive six-night prelude to the John Carroll Weekend. With the enriching guidance of experts, explore Ireland's timeless villages and spectacular history amid lush valleys and misty glens.

Enjoy luxury accommodations at acclaimed historic estates, including Dromoland Castle, the ancestral home to a storied royal family since the 16th century. You will have private guided access to millennia-old religious sites that speak to the island's enduring spiritual traditions, including a seventh-century monastic site that established Ireland as a religious center. Take special inside looks at ornate cathedrals such as Kilkenny's 13th-century St. Canice's Cathedral.

Go behind the scenes of gardens and medieval castles, including the grand 12th-century Kilkenny Castle. Gather for dinner and a performance at 15th-century Bunratty Castle, considered one of Ireland's most beautifully preserved castles. At the legendary Rock of Cashel, take an expert-led inside look at impressive medieval buildings. Along Ireland's famed rugged coastline, embark on awe-inspiring scenic drives and savor exclusive meals in gorgeous settings. Stroll along Ireland's UNESCO-listed Cliffs of Moher, precipitous, 320-million-year-old cliffs where nesting seabirds make their home, part of the dramatic seaside rock face lining Ireland's Wild Atlantic Way.



Along the way, immerse yourself in optional exclusive activities like falconry, horseback riding, archery, clay shooting, whiskey tastings, and golfing or spa treatments. 


TRIP HIGHLIGHTS



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THURSDAY, APRIL 11: DEPARTURE

Depart for Shannon, Ireland, on an overnight flight.

FRIDAY, APRIL 12: SHANNON, IRELAND / NEWMARKET-ON-FERGUS / BUNRATTY

Arrive this morning and transfer to Dromoland Castle in Newmarket-on-Fergus. If time permits, engage in some of the estate's traditionally Irish recreational activities, including archery, clay shooting, or falconry. Alternatively, enjoy a stroll through the castle's luxuriant Walled Gardens. Then gather for a festive dinner at nearby Bunratty Castle, a 15th-century tower house considered one of Ireland's most beautiful and well-preserved castles. Before dinner, explore the Folk Park, an open-air museum featuring a meticulously reconstructed replica of a 19th-century Irish village with traditional thatched-roof cottages. You will be transported to the Middle Ages at the castle's Medieval Banquet and welcomed to the Castle's 15th-century Great Hall with a glass of mead before enjoying a stirring performance by the famed Bunratty Castle Singers.


SATURDAY, APRIL 13: NEWMARKET-ON-FERGUS / LISCANNOR / LAHINCH

Arise early and travel to the stunning western coastline of Ireland to view and stroll the spectacular seaside Cliffs of Moher. Formed over 320 million years ago, these vertical, sheer cliffs offer stunning views of the Aran Islands. This UNESCO Global Geopark is also host to major colonies of nesting seabirds. Enjoy lunch together in the area, then drive to the nearby beach town of Lahinch, one of Western Europe's "surf centers." Stroll through local shops before returning to the hotel in the late afternoon. Enjoy a group dinner at the hotel tonight.

SUNDAY, APRIL 14: NEWMARKET-ON-FERGUS / CASHEL / KILKENNY / THOMASTOWN

Check out of the hotel and transfer to the historic Rock of Cashel. On this dramatic outcrop of limestone lies Ireland's most impressive cluster of medieval buildings, some dating back to the 12th century. Numerous ancient relics are housed here in the Hall of the Vicars, including several Celtic artifacts like the original Cross of St. Patrick, a 15th-century Tower House, and Cormac's Chapel, which contains Ireland's only surviving Romanesque frescoes. After lunch, continue to the medieval town of Kilkenny and arrive at the Smithwick's Experience, where more than 300 years of history combine with innovative brewing processes. Through this hands-on guided tour, learn how the Smithwick family brewed this celebrated Irish ale and take part in the brewing process. Continue to our hotel for the next two nights. Dinner is at leisure. B.L



MONDAY, APRIL 15: THOMASTOWN / KILKENNY

Enjoy a special morning walking tour of Kilkenny, which began as a sixth-century ecclesiastical foundation and was granted city status in 1609. Stroll through one of Ireland's prettiest towns, with its medieval buildings and its delightfully tangled narrow streets filled with charming shops. Stop to view the remarkably well-preserved 13th-century St. Canice's Cathedral, the second largest in Ireland after St. Patrick's and an important site for Christian worship for over 1,400 years. Visit the grand 12th-century Kilkenny Castle, built to control a fording part of the River Nore and the junction of several routeways. Inside, you will find a fascinating art gallery.


Enjoy some free time to visit the 18th-century buildings opposite the castle, reimagined now as the Kilkenny Design Centre, featuring local artists' designs and crafts. Have lunch at leisure in the town. Return to the hotel for an afternoon of optional activities: golf on a championship course, enjoy a horseback ride through the 500-acre estate, receive a comprehensive archery lesson, or indulge in a spa treatment. Dinner tonight is at the hotel.

TUESDAY, APRIL 16: THOMASTOWN / KILKENNY / GLENDALOUGH / BRAY / ENNISKERRY

Depart and travel through the heart of County Wicklow and soak in its tranquil landscapes, lush valleys, and misty glens. Stop at a nearby parish church, St. Kevin's, for an informal Mass (pending confirmation). Afterwards, drive to the ethereal monastic site of Glendalough. In the early seventh century, St. Kevin, one of Ireland's most revered saints founded a monastery in a stunning glaciated valley. This site became one of Europe's most famous religious centers. The remnants of this monastic complex include



a superb round tower, several medieval churches, and intricately carved crosses. After lunch in the area, transfer to Kilruddery House. Tour this lovely private home (pending confirmation) and farm, the family residence of Lord & Lady Ardee and three generations of the Brabazon family. Stroll through this magnificent 800-acre estate which features formal 17th-century landscaped gardens, flowering woodlands, and a walled garden. Continue to our hotel for the next two nights and enjoy dinner at leisure.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 17: ENNISKERRY

After breakfast, drive to nearby Powerscourt House & Gardens, one of the most magnificent estates in Ireland. Stone terraces provide vantage points to view the gardens and formal fountains. Housed within the estate are Italian and Japanese gardens, and a Walled Garden. It is also home to the best of Irish design in gifts, clothes, and furniture. Following the visit, arrive at Powerscourt Distillery, where a 300-year-old converted mill house now accommodates the modern distillery. View the huge copper pot stills and watch a master distiller craft whiskey. End the tour in their tasting room to sample their award-winning Fercullen Whiskey. Return to the hotel for a lovely afternoon tea and some leisure time for activities. Dinner tonight is at a traditional Irish pub with traditional Irish music and dance.

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ACCOMMODATIONS

DROMOLAND CASTLE HOTEL, NEWMARKET-ON-FERGUS

Dromoland Castle, a royal residence since the 16th century, features 97 guest rooms with traditional Irish décor and cozy, Irish linen-topped beds in the main castle. Dining options range from the elegant, chandelier-lit Earl of Thomond restaurant to lighter fare by the fireplace in The Gallery and the famous multi-tiered Afternoon Tea. Live music awaits in the octagonal Cocktail Bar, while The Fig Tree Restaurant offers international cuisine. Guests can partake in castle-appropriate activities such as falconry walks, clay shooting, fishing, and horseback riding, as well as indulging in spa treatments with an outdoor hot tub.
